Protest and Demonstration Planning

The Charlotte-Mecklenburg Police Department strongly supports our citizens' rights to free speech, free assembly and public dissent, and believes that a diverse community is stronger when its citizens are able to express differing opinions on important issues.

Police involvement is generally limited to enforcing any state laws and local ordinances that might apply, ensuring that no breach of the peace occurs during the event, and in working directly with sponsoring groups or organizations to plan events, guiding them through the process of identifying and obtaining any required permits or arrangements that need to be made.

General requirements:

- City-County Parks require scheduling and reservations.
- Protests or Demonstrations on public property or rights-of-way that may have 50 or more participants **require** a Picketing Notice to CMPD (this is **NOT** a permit, only a notification to ensure the City has adequate police resources are available)
- The use of amplified sound equipment, including bullhorns, **requires** an Amplified Sound Permit.
