AN ORDINANCE TRANSFERRING FUNDS FROM THE UNAPPROPRIATED BALANCE OF THE AIRPORT OPERATING FUND TO THE AIRPORT CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS FUND FOR RESURFACING AND SEALING THE AIRCRAFT PARKING RAMP.

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Charlotte, North Carolina;

Section 1. That the sum of \$100,000 is hereby transferred from the unappropriated balance of the Airport Operating Fund 7402 to Account 562.74 - Strengthen Runway 18L/36R of the Airport Capital Improvement Projects Fund 2073. These funds will be used for resurfacing and sealing the Aircraft Parking Ramp.

Section 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 3. This ordinance shall become effective upon its adoption.

AN ORDINANCE ORDERING THE DEMOLITION AND REMOVAL OF THE BUILDING AT 1922 Shamrock Drive PURSUANT TO THE BUILDING CODE OF THE CITY OF CHARLOTTE AND SECTION 6.61, ARTICLE IV, CHAPTER 6, CHARTER OF THE CITY OF CHARLOTTE, SAID BUILDING BEING THE PROPERTY OF Atlantic Richfield Company, 260 S. Broad Street, Philadelphia, Pa.

WHEREAS, the building located at 1922 Shamrock Drive in the City of Charlotte has been found by the Superintendent of Building Inspection to be unsafe and dangerous to life by reason of being structurally unsafe, open and unoccupied and the owners thereof, have been ordered to demolish building and remove the remnants of the building, all pursuant to the Building Code of the City of Charlotte and Section 6.61, Article IV, of the Charter of the City of Charlotte, and

WHEREAS, said owners have failed to comply with said order served by certified mail on January 26, 1977 and February 7, 1977, NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Charlotte, North Carolina, that the Superintendent of Building Inspection is hereby ordered to cause the demolition and removal of the building located at 1922 Shamrock Drive in the City of Charlotte in accordance with the Building Code of the City of Charlotte and Section 6.61, Article IV, Chapter 6, of the Charter of the City of Charlotte.

to cause the demolition and removal of the dwelling located at

Chapter 160A of the General Statutes of North Carolina.
