An Ordinance Amending the City Code
with respect to the Zoning Ordinance

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHARLOTTE:

Section 1. Chapter 23 "Zoning" of the Code of the City of Charlotte
is hereby amended as follows:

Amend Article V, Division 1 Off-Street Parking Requirements, Sec.
23-62 by adding after "Dwellings, Multi-Family" the following new
Type of Use:

"Dwellings, Multi-Family in
Low Income Public Housing
Projects Constructed By or
For the Housing Authority of
The City of Charlotte:

Family Projects	.75 spaces per dwelling unit in all districts
Senior Citizen Projects	.50 spaces per dwelling unit in all districts

Section 2. That, this ordinance shall become effective upon its

AN ORDINANCE ORDERING THE REMOVAL OF AN ABANDONED MOTOR VEHICLE(S) LOCATED AT 3223 SUNNYBROOK DR. PURSUANT TO THE ARTICLE 13-1.2 OF THE CODE OF CHARLOTTE AND CHAPTER 160-200 (43) OF THE GENERAL STATUTES OF NORTH CAROLINA.

WHEREAS, an abandoned motor vehicle (s) located at 3223 Sunnybrook Dr., Charlotte, North Carolina, in the City of Charlotte, N. C., has been found by the Supervisor of the Community Improvement Division of the Building Inspection Department to be unsafe and to constitute a health hazard, and the owner(s) thereof has/have been ordered to remove said abandoned motor vehicle (s), all pursuant to the Article 13-1.2 of the Code of the City of Charlotte and Chapter 160-200 (43) of the General Statutes of North Carolina, and

WHEREAS, said owner (s) has/have failed to comply with said order served by registered mail on February 28th, 1969; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council, upon consideration of the evidence, finds as a fact that the aforesaid vehicle (s) is unsafe and constitutes a health hazard;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Charlotte, North Carolina, that the Supervisor of the Community Improvement Division of the Building Inspection Department is hereby ordered to cause the removal of said abandoned motor vehicle (s) located at 3223 Sunnybrook Drive, Charlotte, N. C., in the City of Charlotte in accordance with Article 13-1.2 of the Code of the City of Charlotte and Chapter 160-200 (43) of the General Statutes of North Carolina.

ORDINANCE NO. 172

AMENDING CHAPTER 20,
SECTION 120

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 20, SECTION 120, OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF CHARLOTTE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Charlotte, North Carolina:

Section 1. Chapter 20, Section 120 of the Code of the City of Charlotte is hereby amended by the addition of the following at the end of the section:

"Meter violations shall be delinquent after the fifth day from issuance of citation. Thereafter, the following civil penalties shall apply to meter violations:

| (3) Eleven or more days delinquent | 10.00" |
