
AN ORDINANCE TRANSFERRING FUNDS FROM 1969 REDEVELOPMENT BONDS TO THE BROOKLYN URBAN RENEWAL II ACCOUNT.

Section I. That the sum of \$11,000 is hereby transferred from Account 4183 (1969 Renewal Bonds) to Account 535.02 (Brooklyn Urban Renewal), these funds to be used to pay a portion of the cost of installing underground electric lines on McDowell Street from 4th Street to Independence Blvd.
