

ORDINANCE NO. 418-X

AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 91-X

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 91-X, THE 1978-79 BUDGET ORDINANCE, AMENDING REVENUES AND EXPENDITURES TO ESTABLISH AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE TRANSPORTATION UNIFIED WORK PROGRAM.

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Charlotte, North Carolina;

Section 1. That the sum of \$148,560 is hereby appropriated to provide funds for the City staff effort in the FY 79 Transportation Unified Work Program.

Section 2. That Section 3, Schedule A-General Fund Revenues, is hereby amended to increase the intergovernmental revenue estimate by \$118,848 to reflect the additional grant revenue to be derived from the Section 112 Program.

Section 3. That the sum of \$29,712 is hereby transferred to Account 531.45, PL-112 - FY 79 Unified Work Program from the following General Fund sources to provide the local match in support of the grant:
