### **CMPD Officers to Assist at Presidential Inauguration**

A contingent of 40 CMPD officers will travel to Washington, D.C. to assist with security for Monday's Presidential Inauguration. The event has been designated as a National Special Security Event, the same designation given to the Democratic National Convention. The security needs associated with the event require the Washington, D.C. Police to seek assistance from police agencies throughout the country.

The 40 officers will leave Charlotte around 7:00 a.m. on Saturday January 19. They will be sworn in and briefed on their duties on January 20. On Inauguration Day, they will be assigned to crowd control duties for the Presidential Gala at the Washington Convention Center. The officers will return to Charlotte on the morning of January 22. Salaries and expenses for the officers will be reimbursed by the Federal Government. Officers will be indemnified by the Washington, D.C. Police Department.

WBTV reporter Steve Crump plans to do a story on the CMPD officers assigned to the inauguration. He will cover their departure from Charlotte on Saturday morning and catch up with them as they carry out their duties on Inauguration Day.
