### Agenda Item #5 – 2040 Metropolitan Transportation Plan

The Charlotte Regional Transportation Planning Organization (CRTPO) is scheduled to adopt the 2040 Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) on April 16. CRTPO is the new name for the Mecklenburg Union Metropolitan Planning Organization (MUMPO). The Metropolitan Transportation Plan was formerly known as the LRTP, or Long Range Transportation Plan. Council member Lyles serves as the City's delegate to the Planning Organization.

Staff will brief Council about the Plan at the April 14 dinner meeting. Council members can find the full version of the 2040 Metropolitan Transportation Plan posted on the CRTPO's website: <http://crtpo.org/plans-programs/metropolitan-transportation-plan>

The briefing will include information about roadway projects expected to be built through 2040 using funding assumptions based on the state's Strategic Transportation Investment formulas. Table 1 below lists four roadway projects that were listed for funding in the 2035 Plan but are no longer included in the 2040 Plan. Table 2 lists twenty nine new projects added to the 2040 Plan that were not in the 2035 Plan.

**Agenda Item #14 – Public Hearing on Fiscal Year 2015 Annual Action Plan for Housing and Community Development**

At the April 14 City Council meeting, a public hearing will be held on the FY2015 Annual Action Plan for Housing and Community Development (Plan). The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) mandates the development of the Plan to receive federal funding for housing and community development activities. The Plan is the City’s annual strategy for providing housing and community development activities.

Each of the proposed activities and projects identified in the Plan are intended to principally benefit priority needs households - those households with incomes ranging from 0%-80% of the Area Median Income. The Plan addresses the City’s overall housing and community development priorities including:

- Revitalizing Neighborhoods
- Revitalizing Distressed Business Corridors
- Increasing affordable rental housing for priority needs households
- Continuing the implementation of Charlotte-Mecklenburg’s Ten-Year Plan to End and Prevent Homelessness
- Promoting Economic Growth

Based on recent notification from the regional HUD Office, in FY2015 the City expects to receive the following federal funding allocations:

Neighborhood & Business Services staff convened three public meetings to receive community input to develop the Plan. Additionally, a copy of the draft Plan, in both English and Spanish, was placed in the Charlotte Housing Authority main office, Old City Hall, and several libraries throughout the City.

On March 19, 2014, the Housing and hearing on April 14, City Council will be asked to approve the Plan at the April 28, 2014 business meeting.

The Arts & Science Council plans to fund painting the underpass at North Tryon Street/Interstate-277 to build excitement about upcoming North Tryon Business Corridor enhancements. This location is part of the North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT) right-of-way, and is subject to NCDOT's Art in the Right-of-Way Policy. The NCDOT Art in the Right-of-Way Policy requires a City Council resolution in order to proceed with the project, a request for which is included in the April 14 Council Business Agenda. Completion of the underpass painting is anticipated in early June. The underpass at North Tryon Street/Interstate-277 is the fourth project in Charlotte that falls under the NCDOT Art in the Right-of-Way Policy, which was adopted by NCDOT in December 2010.
