The Mayor and Council are invited to attend the second annual Demo Day for RevTech Labs and Social Innovation Fellowship. Demo Day will occur on Wednesday, June 5, 2013 from 1:00 p.m. – 5:00 p.m. at Packard Place, 222 South Church Street.

Demo Day is an invite only event where attendees will hear pitches from ten Charlotte-based tech startups. These startups are finishing a three month period in RevTech Labs. ### **June 6 – Public Meeting for Future Atlanta-Charlotte Passenger Rail Service**

A public information and scoping meeting about the future of passenger rail service between Atlanta and Charlotte will be held in Charlotte on June 6, 2013 from 3 p.m. until 6 p.m. at the Metrolina Regional Transportation Management Center located at 2327 Tipton Drive. This is one of three meetings (one each in Georgia, South Carolina and North Carolina) that will be held in June for the development of a Passenger Rail Corridor Investment Plan for the proposed new service.

The Atlanta to Charlotte Passenger Rail Corridor is an extension of the Southeast High-Speed Rail Corridor, which is under development from Charlotte to Washington, DC. The extension from Charlotte would travel southeast through portions of South Carolina and into Atlanta. The exact alternative corridor routes have not yet been established and will be finalized as a part of the scoping process. That process will also address connectivity to proposed and existing passenger rail stations, airports, and other regional transportation services along the corridor. In particular, the project will consider connectivity to the proposed Georgia Multi Modal Passenger Terminal and Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport in Atlanta, and the proposed Charlotte Gateway Station and Charlotte-Douglas International Airport.

### **June 14 – Mayor’s Youth Employment Kickoff**

The kickoff event for the 28th season of the Mayor’s Youth Employment Program (MYEP) will be Friday, June 14, 2013, from noon to 2:00 p.m. at Time Warner Cable Arena. All City Council members are invited to attend.

This event will mark the beginning of the eight-week program where 307 area youth ages 16 – 18 are placed by skill set with jobs hosted by 84 area companies and organizations. The youth will meet their supervisors and then report to their worksites after the event.

Participants in the program will make at least \$8.00 an hour and work a minimum of 20 hours a week for the next eight weeks. All participants in the program have undergone a background

check, drug screening, and job skills training classes prior to being accepted in the MYEP program. Each youth will also undergo an employee orientation at their respective job site.

The public sector is also providing employment opportunities for youth. This year, the City is providing 81 and the County is providing 36 MYEP jobs.

Mayor Foxx made special efforts to champion MYEP with area employers. Due to his contribution, this year's program will see more than 300 youth obtaining jobs and 3000 career experiences for program youth. This is a record year for the number of employers participating.

### **May 31 State Legislative Update**

Attached is the Week 18 Legislative Report, which includes updates on bills of interest to the City of Charlotte. In what turned into "Tax Reform Thursday", both the House and Senate Finance Committees heard a total of three tax reform proposals on Thursday, May 30. House Finance heard HB 998 (Lewis), Tax Simplification and Reduction Act, and Senate Finance heard SB 374 (Clodfelter), Lower Tax Rates for Stronger NC Economy, and SB 677 (Rucho), North Carolina Fair Tax Act of 2013. Neither Committee took any action. On Tuesday June 4, 2013 the Airport Authority bill, SB 81, will be considered by the House Transportation Committee.
