### **Agenda Item #28 –Police and Fire Communications Study**

Charlotte Mecklenburg Police Department (CMPD) negotiated a contract with Fields Consulting Group, which City Council approved on June 10, 2013 in the amount of \$60,000. Prior to signing the contract, Fields Consulting Group stated they could not perform the work for \$60,000, and requested a new quote exceeding \$100,000. As a result, CMPD and Fire approached Procurement Management to initiate a formal procurement process.

A Request for Proposals (RFP) was publicly posted on the NC Interactive Purchasing System on August 1, 2013. The City also sent notice to vendors in the City's vendor database as well as additional vendors identified by CMPD and Fire, including Fields Consulting Group. A total of

eight (8) proposals were received on August 29.

The proposals were evaluated on criteria including, but not limited to, vendor qualifications, experience with performing similar services, compliance with the scope of work and terms and conditions, references, and cost effectiveness and value.

The pricing from responding vendors ranged from \$68,200 to \$497,100. Fields Consulting Group did not submit a proposal. Instead, Fields Consulting was included as a subcontractor in a proposal submitted by LR Kimball Inc., whose pricing totaled \$318,550. The vendor chosen by CMPD and Fire is Mission Critical Partners, whose proposed pricing is \$137,920. CMPD and Fire determined that Mission Critical Partners' proposal provides best value to the City based on the evaluation criteria and the proposed project plan; and that this is a reasonable cost, given the scope of the work.

**Western Union Speedpay Convenience Fee Decrease**

Finance has negotiated a cost reduction and expansion of payment card brands for customers who pay their utility bills using Western Union Speedpay's online (web) and interactive voice response (phone) system.

On average, 32,000 utility payments are received monthly using this electronic payment channel, representing 12% of utility customers. The current credit cards accepted are Visa, MasterCard, and Discover, along with debit and ATM cards. Customers can also use their checking or savings accounts. The convenience fee is \$1.95 per transaction with a \$500 maximum payment.

When the new pricing is implemented, customers will only pay \$1.25 with no ceiling amount per transaction, and American Express will be added as a credit card option. Finance believes this change will continue to promote and expand the use of our low cost electronic payment

options by saving customers \$0.70 per transaction, eliminating the payment threshold, and adding a new payment card brand.

Finance is working with Western Union to amend the City's contract and determine the implementation date. Staff will work with Corporate Communications and Utilities to roll out this change to customers.
