SUBJECT: **Week 21 State Legislative Report**

HOT TOPICS

Charlotte Regional Airport Authority Act (SB 81 – Rucho) transfers control of the Charlotte Douglas International Airport from the City of Charlotte to an independent Authority; SB 81 reported out of House Transportation Committee on 6/4; will be heard next in House Finance; City Council adopted resolution on 6/10 that: (1) supports airport governance structure that maintains CLTs best performing and lowest cost status, regardless of whether it is a city department, authority or some other model, (2) directed City Manager to fully evaluate and implement best practices for airport finances, contracts, procurement, human resources, and public safety, and to work with all stakeholders, including legislators, in undertaking these evaluations, and (3) unambiguously stated it would vigorously resist any outside, unilateral changes that threaten the airport's performance and cost status

State Budget (SB 402 – Brunstetter) for FY 2014 and FY 2015 passed Senate 5/23 and House on 6/13; Blue Line Extension funding is included in Public Transportation Division budget; conference process is in process; Senate and House leadership plan for adoption of conference report by 6/27 for transmittal to Governor

Strategic Transportation Investments (HB 817 – W. Brawley) is Governor's transportation reform package that reallocates existing transportation resources among the various regions of the State; faced with a \$1.7 billion decrease in transportation funding over the next ten years and an expected 1.3 million increase in population, the intent of the "strategic mobility formula" is to refocus spending on projects that pass a prioritization process producing the most economic benefits and greatest improvements in travel times; Senate passed and House concurred; ratified and sent to Governor

Tax Reform: Senate tax reform plan that was substituted into the House tax reform plan, [HB 998](#), Tax Simplification and Reduction Act (Lewis) met enormous resistance from many quarters, including local governments; local governments would face cumulative \$250 million reduction from Senate plan when fully implemented in FY 19, while City of Charlotte fiscal impact, according to NCLM, would be approximately \$31 million, which compares very unfavorably with House version of HB 998; City opposes Senate version of HB 998

LEGISLATIVE AGENDA

Public Transportation Buses (HB 375 – Jeter) allows buses owned and operated by the City of Charlotte that are 46 to 60 feet in length to be operated primarily on roadways with speed limits over 45 miles per hour; passed House and referred to Senate Rules

Infrastructure Improvements (SB 103 – Hartsell) extends sunset date of the Special Assessments for Critical Infrastructure Needs Act of 2008 by two years to July 1, 2015, which is needed for continued examination of Red Line Regional Rail project; passed Senate; reported out of House Government House Finance; re-referred to House Rules from House floor

Long Term Investment Program (SB 276 – Clodfelter) amends City’s long term investment authority to enable use of “prudent investor” rule; referred to Senate State and Local Government where it has not moved

Transportation Project Financing (SB 322 – Clodfelter) allows local governments to use special obligation bond financing for public transportation projects, thereby facilitating local participation in the federal Transportation Infrastructure Financing and Innovation Act (TIFIA) program; referred to Senate Finance where it has not moved

Film Production Tax Credit: HB 994 (Luebke) negatively alters the film production tax credit program and would make the credit “nonrefundable” so that out-of-state production companies would not benefit; HB 994 referred to House Rules; City opposes HB 994

DEVELOPING ISSUES

Mecklenburg Revaluation (HB 200 – W. Brawley / SB 159 – Tarte) corrects issues related to the recent Mecklenburg County revaluation; SB 159 passed Senate and reported out of House Government, and then re-referred to House Regulatory Reform; HB 200 passed House and reported out of Senate Finance, and then re-referred to Senate Rules

Zoning/Design & Aesthetic Controls (HB 150 – Dollar) restricts use of design standards by counties and cities for any residential dwelling subject to the NC Residential Code for One and Two Family Dwellings; passed House and reported out of Senate Rules but was re-referred back to Committee from the floor; City opposes HB 150

Rental Property Ordinances (HB 773 – W. Brawley) repeals several provisions of legislation passed in 2011 that became basis for 2012 changes to Charlotte rental property ordinance; bill prohibits mandatory registration of all rental properties which makes it nearly impossible to notify property owners and landlords of crimes committed on their properties, which the bill also requires; there are at least ten other NC towns and cities that have rental program impacted by HB 773; passed House and referred to Senate Commerce; City opposes HB 773

Amends Environmental Laws 2013 (SB 112 – Jackson) is omnibus environmental laws bill considered every session; Senate passed version includes provision requiring local governments to obtain approval of Governor and Council of State prior to securing an interest in contaminated real property, which presents issues of costs and timeliness in securing right-of-way for major projects such as the BLE, utility lines, airport land expansion, etc.; referred to House Environment; since it passed Senate, staff from City and League have worked with co-sponsor Senator Brock on language exempting local government from this provision

Regulatory Reform Act of 2013 (SB 612 – Brown) states that local government environmental ordinances or regulations that regulate fields also regulated by the State or federal government and are more stringent than State or federal government standards are preempted, which would invalidate many of the City's environmental regulations exceeding state and federal mandates covering erosion control, post construction controls, stream buffer protections, nutrient controls, and stormwater detention; passed Senate and referred to House Regulatory Reform; City opposes SB 612

MPO Ethics (SB 411 – Rabon) amends 2012 legislation requiring greater disclosure of individuals appointed by local governments to serve on MPO boards by requiring any individual with voting authority on a MPO board to follow State Government ethics guidelines; passed Senate and House and sent to Governor

Amend Interbasin Law (SB 341 – Rabon) was reported out of House Environment on 6/20 and amended to remove one of the three requirements that must be met for the assets, including debt, of any city owned water utility serving more than 120,000 people to be transferred to a metropolitan sewerage district as an operation of law; the requirement removed is that a water utility has not been issued a certificate for an interbasin transfer, which leaves the population threshold (120,000 people) and the existence of a metropolitan sewerage district in place
