Charlotte-Mecklenburg Storm Water Services has been working diligently to complete the easement acquisition process. The Real Estate acquisition agents, Stephen and Josh Frey of Professional Land Management, expect to complete the real estate phase by the end of March 2016. If acquisition agents have contacted you about easements for your property, please respond to them promptly.

Next Steps:

At the public meeting in August, the project team discussed the preliminary construction drawings and the easement acquisition process with property owners. The project is expected to alleviate drainage issues in the neighborhood. Next steps include completing the real estate phase, acquiring the necessary permits and finalizing the design plans.
