Dear Resident,

Charlotte-Mecklenburg Storm Water Services held a public meeting May 10 at the Betty Rae Thomas Recreation Center for the Blenheim Storm Drainage Improvement Project. The project goals are to update infrastructure, reduce flooding of structures and streets, provide emergency access, reduce erosion and increase stream capacity.

Meeting highlights:

- Project Manager Greg Cole introduced the project team and gave a presentation on the project history, boundaries and proposed improvements.
- This is a very challenging and difficult stormwater project with no easy solutions.
- There are four areas where work is being performed; Morgan Street area, South Hoskins Street culvert, Welling Avenue, and Blenheim Road and Rochelle Lane area.

- The project improvements include creating areas to store stormwater more safely, replacing two culverts, replacing failing stormwater structures (such as pipes, inlets and manholes) and providing emergency access to Blenheim Road and Rochelle Lane.
- The City is proposing to acquire some properties along Welling Avenue, Blenheim Road and Garfield Street to create areas for safely storing flood water.
- A question and answer session was held.
