Dear Resident,

Charlotte-Mecklenburg Storm Water Services and consulting engineer, Armstrong Glen, continue to work on the Gaynor Storm Drainage Improvement Project. Easement acquisition is complete and the final design plans are under review.

The bid phase should begin in the next few months. During the bid phase, the final plans will be circulated to qualified contractors for a competitive bidding process. By state law, the lowest responsible bidder is awarded the construction contract. The bid phase

typically lasts 6 months.

Property along creeks and lakes should be planted with native trees and shrubs.



**ROOTS**

Roots anchor the soil, reduce flood damage and take up excess fertilizers.



**COOL TEMPERATURES**

Shade keeps the water cool, allowing fish and aquatic life to thrive.



**WILDLIFE HABITAT**

Shaded streams provide valuable habitat for wildlife.
