Dear Resident:

Charlotte-Mecklenburg Storm Water Services and engineering consultant, Armstrong Glen, P.C., are in the design phase of the Kenilworth/Romany Storm Drainage Improvement Project. During this phase we will develop construction plans and obtain all required permits from federal and state government agencies. The design phase typically lasts 18 to 30 months.

The project boundaries are East Boulevard to the southwest, Euclid Avenue to the northwest, Berkeley Avenue and East Morehead Street to the northeast and Upper Little Sugar Creek to the

southeast. The project goal is to reduce street and structure flooding by improving storm drainage infrastructure.

When you clean your car, don't forget this detail:

Soap will clean your car, but it won't clean our streams.

Don't wash your car on your driveway or in the street. Soap suds flow to the nearest storm drain, then directly into the nearest creek. That could kill fish and other aquatic life.

Instead, park your car on your lawn to wash it. Or, better yet, take your car to a professional car wash where the water is cleaned. You'll have a clean car and all of us will have clean streams.
