Charlotte Mecklenburg Storm Water Services and consultant US Infrastructure are completing final construction drawings. Easement acquisition is complete and the bid phase is next. During this phase, the final design plans will be circulated to qualified contractors for a competitive bidding process. After City Council approval, the construction contract is awarded to the lowest responsible bidder. Bid phase typically lasts six months, with construction estimated to take two years. Construction will start at the downstream end of the project at Hawthorne Lane and CSXT Railroad.
