YOUR STORM WATER FEES AT WORK

April 2015

Charlotte-Mecklenburg Storm Water Services, along with consulting engineer, WK Dickson & Co., Inc., are finalizing the construction plans. All required water quality permits from Federal and State government agencies have been acquired.

The bid phase is expected to start in the next few months, during which competitive bids are taken from responsible contractors to perform the work. After City Council approval, the construction contract is awarded to the lowest responsible bidder. Bid phase typically lasts 6 to 9 months.
