Charlotte-Mecklenburg Storm Water Services has begun the easement acquisition phase of the Princeton/Somerset Storm Drainage Improvement Project. During this phase, real estate consulting agents from Gulf Coast LLC will be contacting property owners if easements are needed to construct the proposed improvements. This phase of the project typically lasts 9 to 12 months.

Project managers work very hard to keep project costs down, including easement costs. The City requests that easements be donated to provide access to your property to make the recommended improvements and provide future maintenance. Continued support and cooperation is greatly appreciated.

Property along creeks and lakes should be planted with native trees and shrubs.



ROOTS

Roots anchor the soil, reduce flood damage and take up excess fertilizers.

Shaded streams provide valuable habitat for wildlife.
