

Charlotte-Mecklenburg Storm Water Services and Armstrong Glen continue with the design phase. Additional survey work in the neighborhood has been completed and is being incorporated into the preliminary construction drawings.

City staff will coordinate with all the utility companies in the area to resolve potential conflicts and concerns. The project goals are to reduce structure and street flooding throughout the neighborhood

Waterways Need Plant Buffers

Buffers are trees, bushes, and deep rooted plants along a stream, pond, river or lake. They reduce property loss from erosion, support fish and wildlife, and improve water quality.

If my property is eroding, what can I do?

- Plant native bushes and trees!
- Leave grass unmowed.
- Keep herbicides away.
