Charlotte-Mecklenburg Storm Water Services, along with engineering consultant US Infrastructure of Carolina, Inc., continue to work through the planning phase. The project goal is to reduce flooding of streets and structures by improving the storm drainage infrastructure within the project area, while not causing downstream impacts. Several improvement alternatives have been identified and developed for each issue. City staff continue to analyze potential alternatives to address the drainage issues and concerns in the neighborhood.

A public meeting will be scheduled to present the recommended solution and solicit input from residents. Meeting details will be mailed to residents approximately two weeks prior to the meeting.
