Is your pet prepared for the 4th of July

Charlotte, NC – June 28, 2022, The Charlotte-Mecklenburg Police Department's <u>Animal Care & Control Division</u> (AC&C) is teaming up with some local businesses to hold their first-ever PREP YOUR PET DAY ahead of the 4th of July holiday.

The 4th of July holiday is upon us and millions of people are preparing to fire up the grills, add "Born in the USA" to their music playlist, and have stocked up on all kinds of fireworks, sparklers, and firecrackers for the nighttime entertainment.



"It may be party-time for humans, but it can be a tough, long weekend for a lot of our furry friends," says Melissa Knicely, Communications Manager for CMPD Animal Care & Control. "Every year we team up with the media to send out pro-active messaging before the 4th about how to protect your pets from getting lost and then we do follow-up stories afterward on how many lost pets entered the shelter due to the 4th of July festivities. This year we decided to do something bigger and better, ensure Charlotte-Mecklenburg pets are protected."

PREP YOUR PET DAY will offer Charlotte Metro area residents the opportunity to:

- 1 if your pet is microchipped, have the chip checked and <u>update your pet's registration</u> information for FREE.
- 2 If your pet needs a microchip, thanks to a microchip donation from <u>PetLink</u>, we will microchip your pet for FREE.
- 3 if your pet does not have an i.d. tag on its collar we will make you one for FREE.
- 4 if your pet is not vaccinated for rabies, we will vaccinate in FREE.









PREP A SAFE HAVEN:

If your pet is upset by thunder, a door slamming, or other loud noises, 4th of July fireworks will be utterly terrifying, so take these precautions:

- 1 Your pets won't enjoy the fireworks display, so leave them at home! Keep them inside, shielded from loud noises. A walk-in closet is perfect to set up as a safe room and add music to block out noise.
- 2 If you know your pets are afraid of fireworks, seek advice from your veterinarian ahead of time for medications or supplements that may assist to calm your pet.
- 3 If you are hosting a party, ensure your pets have a quiet spot to escape all the activity and check the exterior doors frequently to make sure your pets can't escape.
