RESOLUTION ORDERING THE MAKING OF CERTAIN LOCAL IMPROVEMENTS ON DRUID CIRCLE, FROM MORETZ AVENUE TO STATESVILLE AVENUE.

WHEREAS, the City Council has been petitioned to make improvement on Druid Circle, from Moretz Avenue to Statesville Avenue, pursuant to the General Statutes and City Charter, and the City Clerk has certified the sufficiency of said petition and submitted same to the City Council, and

WHEREAS, the City Council has held a public hearing on said petition and now determines that said improvements should be made, NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Charlotte, North Carolina:

1. That said petition is duly signed by 61% of the number of owners, who represent 62% of all the lineal feet of frontage, of the lands abutting upon the proposed improvements and that said petition is hereby determined to be sufficient.

2. That Druid Circle, from Moretz Avenue to Statesville, Avenue, a distance of approximately 1,787-1/2 feet (3,475 front feet), be permanently improved by installation of storm drainage facilities and the construction of roll type curb and gutter.

3. That the entire cost of such improvements, exclusive of the cost as incurred at street intersection, shall be assessed upon the properties abutting the improvements according to the extent of the respective frontage thereon by an equal rate per foot of such frontage.

4. That the property owners shall have the option of paying such assessment in cash within thirty (30) days from the first publication of notice of the assessment lien, without interest, or, if they should so elect and give notice in writing to the City within said thirty (30) days, they shall have the option of paying the assessment in not less than two or more than ten equal annual installments, with interest at the rate of six percent (6%) per annum. The first installment with interest shall become due and payable on the date on which taxes are payable, and one subsequent installment and interest shall be due and payable on said date

in each successive year until the assessment is paid in full.

5. That this resolution be published as required by law.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a new Schedule IV "Pay Range Assignment of Classes", attached hereto is hereby incorporated in lieu thereof and shall supercede the present Schedule IV, "Pay Range Assignment of Classes."

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Section 10. Overtime of the present Rules for the Administration of the Pay Plan is hereby amended by deleting the provisions as set forth in the above Section and by incorporating in lieu thereof, the following:

Section 10. Overtime

Overtime work shall include only that work performed by an employee at the direction of a department head or his authorized representative which is in excess of the number of hours constituting the established workweek for the class and for the department or which is performed on an unscheduled work day.

Employees required to work overtime may be granted compensatory time off or may be compensated for such overtime on the basis of 1 1/2 times the overtime hours worked provided that:

a. The class of work is not excluded from entitlement to overtime compensation in Schedule IV.

b. When feasible, the department head shall grant compensatory time off.

Compensatory time off may not be cumulative beyond three months from the time earned.

c. When it is not feasible to permit the absence of employees for the purpose of taking compensatory time off, the department head may, with the prior approval of the Personnel Director, pay employees for overtime hours worked provided there are funds available in the personal services account of the department.

d. Employees required to perform work on regularly scheduled holidays may be granted compensatory time off or cash payment for the hours actually worked in addition to any holiday pay to which they may be entitled.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution shall be effective as of September 25, 1968.
