As of Aug. 1, there are 160 vacancies for patrol officers. With the adoption of the FY 2018 budget, City Council approved an additional 62 patrol officers to the police force. The FY 2018 budget also included four additional officers in the Aviation Division, who provide security service at Charlotte Douglas International Airport.
