Conversations between ATCO, the County, and the State Department of Insurance have confirmed that it is within the County's discretion to approve or deny event permits. Negotiations between the County and ATCO remain ongoing. In addition, the County has intends to formulate a new policy, effective after December 31, 2017, governing special events in existing buildings. City staff will continue to participate in seeking a mutually agreeable resolution to these short-term and long-term building use issues.

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				<p>The developer will require general contractors performing infrastructure work to participate in PIECE hiring, subject to availability, and continue on-going dialogue with nearby business and resident leaders to stimulate opportunities to expand economic mobility.
