

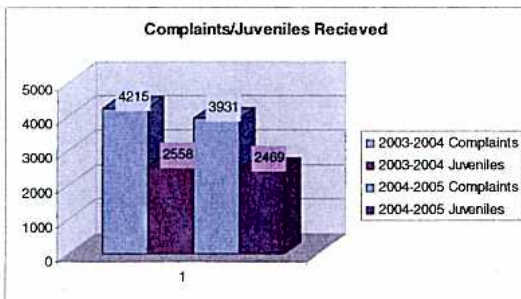

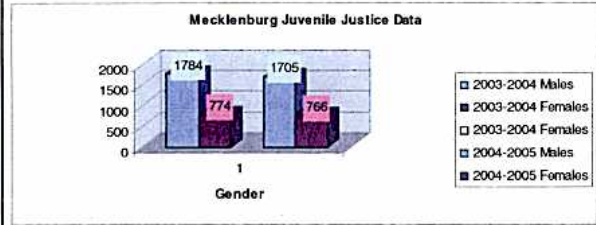

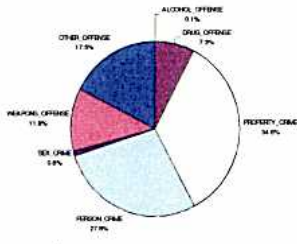
Complaints and Juveniles FY04 and FY05



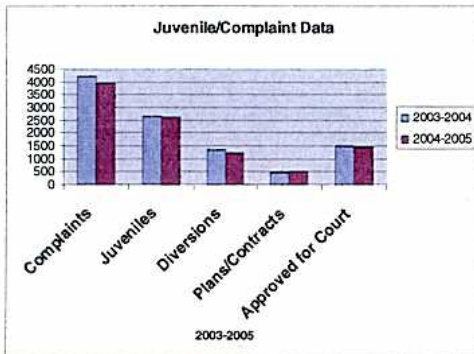

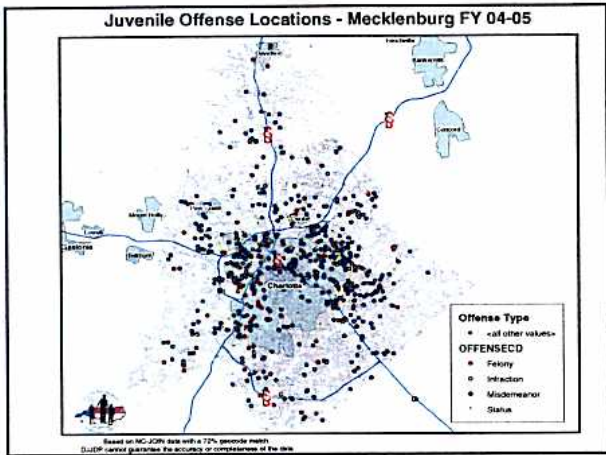


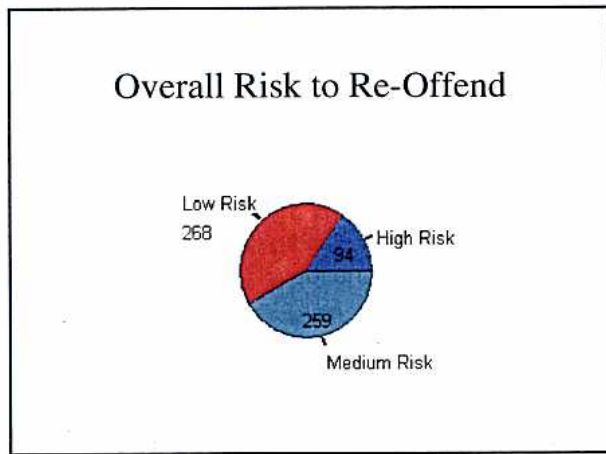
Juveniles Adjudicated for Specific Offense Type Mecklenburg County FY04-05

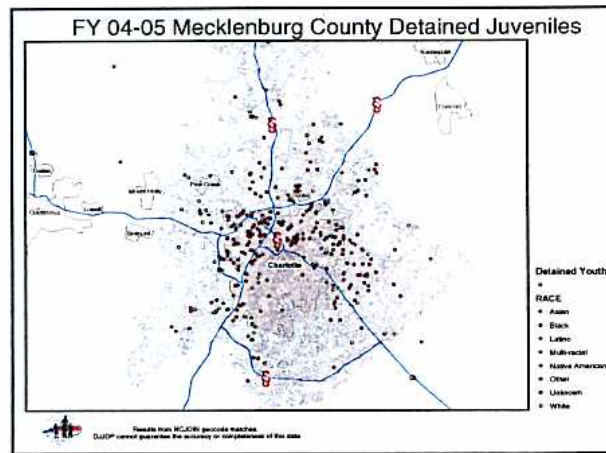

Data on Stable, Threatened and Fragile Neighborhoods



Stable



- Stable Neighborhoods-Score highly on the Social, Physical, Crime, and Economic dimensions.
 - Few Social Problems
 - Low Rates of Crime
 - Few Infrastructure and Housing Needs
 - High levels of economic vitality.

Threatened



- Threatened Neighborhoods- score relatively high on most of the dimensions.
- Show a significant problem on one or more of the dimensions.

Fragile

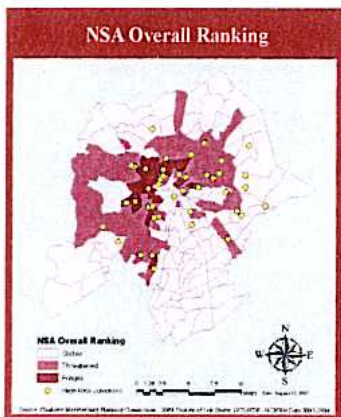


- Fragile Neighborhoods-Generally have low to moderate scores on all four dimensions.
- A fragile neighborhood has a lower quality of life and is "at risk" on multiple dimensions.

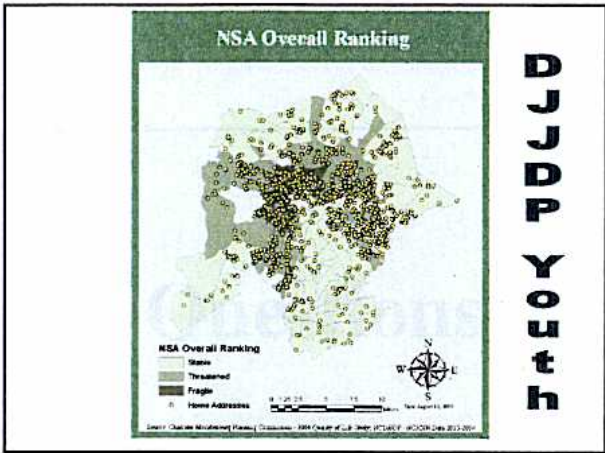
Comparison between Juvenile Justice Data and Threatened and Fragile Neighborhood
