Dear Resident,

Charlotte-Mecklenburg Storm Water Services held its third and final public meeting on November 28, 2011 at Greater Mt. Sinai Baptist Church for the Brentwood Storm Drainage Improvement Project. The goals of this project are to reduce flooding of streets and structures, as well as reduce erosion along the stream and channel.

The meeting identified existing storm water issues, the proposed improvements for the area and the easements required from the property owners to construct the improvements.

Meeting highlights:

- Project Manager Tom Purvis welcomed the attendees and introduced the project team.
- Brad Ross, Project Manager for the City's design consultant, The Isaacs Group, discussed the citizen 311 and modeling exhibit and then discussed the Brentwood CIP design exhibit.
- Mr. Ross discussed the construction phasing and traffic flow at Barringer and Brentwood Place. Monica Kruckow, City Project Manager, said the City was working to find the best routing for

traffic and will keep the neighborhood informed about bus routing issues during construction.

- Steve Frey, City of Charlotte Real Estate, reviewed easements. Staff and Telics agents will be working with residents to acquire easements needed to construct the proposed improvements and provide any future maintenance to installed improvements. The City asks for easements to be donated in exchange for the improvements.
- A question and answer session was held.
