Dear Resident:

Charlotte-Mecklenburg Storm Water Services and Armstrong Glen have begun the design phase of the Hinsdale/Tinkerbell Storm Drainage Improvement Project. Armstrong Glen has been given notice to proceed with designing the preliminary construction documents. The goals are to improve storm drainage infrastructure, reduce street and structure flooding, and reduce erosion.

The areas identified as needing improvements were presented at the December 5th, 2013 public meeting and can be viewed on the project website. Some of the improvements include:

- replacing existing storm drainage pipes that are too small and/or in poor condition,
- increasing the number and size of inlets,
- replacing four major culverts, and
- stabilizing some sections of stream.
