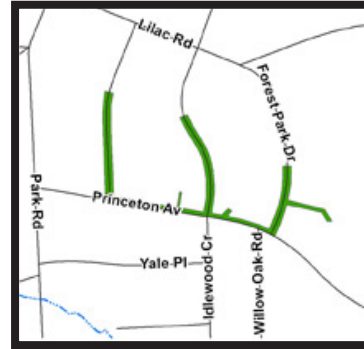

YOUR STORM WATER FEES AT WORK

June 2015

Charlotte-Mecklenburg Storm Water Services continues to finalize the easement acquisition phase and bid phase. During this phase, competitive bids are taken from responsible contractors to perform the work. After City Council approval, the City awards the construction contract to the lowest responsible bidder. The bid phase typically lasts 5 to 6 months, with construction to begin thereafter.

Buffers are trees, bushes, and deep rooted plants along a stream, pond, river or lake. They reduce property loss from erosion, support fish and wildlife, and improve water quality.
