Agenda Item #1 Call to order

Adam Raskoskie called the meeting to order at 6:05PM.

Agenda Item #2 Introductions of members and guests

Also present was Kate Cavazza from Sustain Charlotte.

Each member gave an introduction including a new member, Mayoral appointee Caitlin Tobin. Caitlin is an engineer and planner by trade and was formerly the bicycle and pedestrian planner for the City of Baltimore.

Agenda Item #3 Call to the public

Kate Cavazza reminded everyone that Sustain Charlotte's Biketoberfest was coming up on Sunday October 14th. Sustain Charlotte will be setting up a protected bike lane demonstration along 6th street between Tryon St and Pine St.

Agenda Item #4 Review of the minutes

Debra Franklin moved to approve the July minutes, Bryan Hall seconded and the minutes were approved unanimously.

Agenda Item #5 Informational updates

Shared Mobility Program Update

The Mayor has declared an end to the shared mobility pilot program and referred e scooters to the Transportation and Planning (T&P) committee for discussion and a report to the City Council. Adam Raskoskie and Will Washam provided updates on the T&P committee's discussion regarding e scooter operations and safety. Mr. Washam will keep the committee

updated on any specific developments from city staff regarding staff recommendations for e scooters that will be presented to the T&P committee

Agenda Item #6 New business

Bicycle Network Map

Will Washam was introduced by Adam Raskoskie to present information on the bicycle network map. Mr. Washam stated that the bicycle network map will seek to apply Charlotte BIKES bicycle facility guidance to Charlotte's Thoroughfares. Thoroughfares will be classified as having shared space, standard bike lanes, separated/buffered bike lanes/ or shared use paths. This map will be used to identify the space needed within the right of way to accommodate the appropriate bicycle facility type. This map will be used to inform the streets map that will ultimately be in the city's updated UDO. City staff has made recommendations for streets within Blue Line station areas. Mr. Washam shared that he will be collecting public input on the bicycle network map recommendations for streets with the Blue Line station areas at Biketoberfest on October 14th and staff will continue developing recommendations for the entire thoroughfare network.

Transit Oriented Development

Monica Holmes was introduced by Adam Raskoskie to present information on the City's Transit Oriented Development ordinance update. Ms. Holmes presented that the goal of the TOD update was to provide flexibility among different station areas and serve as a model for the new Unified Development Ordinance. It would Emphasize building form through updated design standards and provide a range of districts based on form and intensity. TOD would provide incentives to get affordable housing, transporting and open space. Ms. Holmes provided a timeline for the development of the TOD ordinance that concluded with a text amendment filing this fall. Bryan Hall asked about the status of the Red Line. Ms. Holmes responded that the redline is under study with the North and West transit corridors. Debra Franklin promoted the idea of including rail trails in the TOD requirements.

Agenda Item #7 Other business

Adam Raskoskie shared that he planned to put the BAC rules and procedures update on to the next agenda.

Haley Beaupre reminded everyone that Open Streets 704 is this weekend.
