Reference 88 - 0.29% Coverage

The traffic and planning plans need improvement. A good example of planning gone bad was East Blvd. It used to function well with 4 lanes for cars. The idea of bike lanes and planting strips is cute,

but not practical. There should have been bus pull out areas like Raleigh has. Traffic in the one and only lane should not be impeded by a bus. This increases traffic incidents and road rage. Also, when a project in land development has reached final plans and construction has started, the inspectors have too much authority to supersede sealed and approved plans- this type of behavior usually is hinged on an interpretation of fire code and costs a project money midstream in construction. This is not fair.
