Councilman Wilkinson, seconded by Councilman Baxter, made a motion that the City advertise the property at the corner of Fifth and College Streets for sale at public auction to the highest bidder for cash, reserving the right to reject any and all bids in the discretion of the City of Charlotte; the property to be advertised 80 feet on Fifth Street as one piece and then as a whole.
