This update will shed light on progress made toward 2030 and 2050 sustainability goals. It is an important checkpoint as the City continues improving implementation in four focus areas: Buildings, Transportation, Energy Generation and Workforce Development.
- The SEAP Update includes an updated Greenhouse Gas Emissions Inventory and broad Climate Risk Assessment.
