COMPLIANCE LETTER FOR CHILDCARE CENTER IN RESIDENCE

A facility run by an individual who resides in a single-family residence that provides supervision or care on a regular basis in the individual's home for children who are not related by blood or marriage, and are not the legal wards or foster children of the supervising adult. Family Childcare Homes must be licensed by the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services. The facility may be established as an accessory use to a single-family detached dwelling unit, in compliance with Article 15.6 of the Unified Development Ordinance (UDO).

- A single-family dwelling containing a childcare center in residence shall be the primary residence of the operator/primary caregiver. 3. New childcare center in residence shall be separated from existing family childcare homes and existing childcare center in residence in 4 a Neighborhood 1 Place Type by a distance of 400 feet. This does not include childcare centers operating as part of a place of worship.
- Outdoor play space and play equipment shall be located to the rear of the principal structure. 5.
- A childcare center in residence shall be limited to a maximum of two employees that reside outside of the residence at any one time. 6.
- The operator's children are not included in the count of the number of children allowed. 7.
