

- Solving Charlotte's affordable housing gap will require collaboration over competition.
- Needs extend beyond housing, including support for food insecurity, immigrants, and services for various vulnerable groups.
- A clear vision is needed for long-term sustainability.
- The right partners are crucial.
- Understanding the development process is key.
- Faith communities have options for leasing or transferring land.
- Select experienced partners for capital and development to help reduce risks.
- Challenges remain in policy, financial support, and neighborhood buy-in.
